FREE TREES FOR FRONT YARDS

In many places along Nyack streets there is not enough room for trees along the sidewalk or under the power lines. The Village of Nyack's Front Yard Tree Planting Program offers free trees to qualifying residents with yards that have adequate space for healthy trees to grow near the sidewalk and street.

At your request, a Village representative will come to see whether your front yard is eligible and determine what kinds of trees would be appropriate.

On planting day in fall or spring, Department of Public Works staff and local volunteers will work together to prepare planting sites and plant the trees according to best practices. Trees will be mulched and supplied with 20 gallon watering bags. Trees will be provided on a first come, first served basis.

Request a site visit to have your front yard considered for a new tree.

Minimum distance from inside edge of sidewalk: 3 feet.

Maximum distance from inside edge of sidewalk: 12 feet.

Homeowner's Responsibilities:

Water the tree for the first two years, April through October (approximately 20 gallons per week—less than \$5 per year.)

Protect the tree. Keep mulch, mowers and weed whackers away from the trunk.

Environmental Benefits

Reduce carbon emissions and ozone levels

Reduce stormwater runoff and impacts on sewer infrastructure

Cool heat islands by 10–20 degrees and reduce peak summer temperatures by up to 10°F

Increase biodiversity and improve habitat for local wildlife

Reduce noise pollution
